Want to help a budding gardener grow? Macomb County MSU Extension (MSUE) is inviting those interested in teaching youth gardening to the "Let's Get Growing!" training program.

There is a \$35 fee for the training which includes the National 4-H Horticulture, Vegetable Gardening and Middle School Garden curricula and additional ideas, lessons and resources.

Those wishing to apply should be at least 16 years old and want to garden with youths, ages 8-14.
