Start Your Own Business and Entrepreneurship Club!

Why Entrepreneurship?

- ▶ Entrepreneurs create 44% of all new businesses.
- ▶ “Small business, not large corporations, are the driving engine that will expand America’s world-wide market in the 21st Century.” (*Be the “E” creators*)

Role of the Group Leader:

- ▶ Encourage youth to learn independently. (Take a back seat.)
- ▶ Help by listening as youth consider questions and draw conclusions.
- ▶ Act as a resource person for some activities.
- ▶ Nurture entrepreneurial leadership to build a stronger economic future for our state, the nation and the world.
- ▶ Recruit experts to assist with pieces of the curriculum.

Educational Tools Available:

- ▶ **Mini-Society® curriculum** — An experience-based system for youth, grades 2 to 6, that teaches entrepreneurship, economics, and citizenship concepts.
- ▶ **Be the “E” Entrepreneurship Activity Guide** — Youth, grades 7 to 12, discover the world of entrepreneurs through this 120-page activity guide. *Be the “E” Entrepreneurship Helper’s Guide* — Additional learn-by-doing activities that can be adapted to 4-H entrepreneurship project groups and/or clubs.
- ▶ **Going Solo** — Curriculum for youth, grades 9 to 12, designed for teaching the concepts and practices of entrepreneurship and business ownership.
- ▶ **NEFE High School Financial Planning Program®** — FREE program to give youth, grades 9 to 12, access to sound money management skills and the financial planning process.



Business Expo:

The annual Michigan 4-H Business and Entrepreneurship Expo is held during 4-H Exploration Days in mid-June on Michigan State University’s campus. The three-day workshop allows participants to choose to be in the Beginner’s Track, which revolves around the theme, “Business in a Box.” Products are made and sold during the Expo. Participants can also choose to be in the Advanced Track, which is for youth that already have businesses established.
