

Need Help Paying for Childcare?

The Child Care Services Program at the Michigan Department of Human Services (DHS) may be able to help you with the cost of childcare if you are:

- ◆ Low income families
- ◆ Licensed foster parents requesting care for foster children
- ◆ Members of a DHS protective or preventive services case participating in an approved treatment program for a physical, mental, or emotional condition
- ◆ Family Independence Program (FIP) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients
- ◆ FIP applicants participating in a required Michigan Works! Agency (MWA) approved activity

The Department of Human Services / Child Care Services Department will determine if you qualify for cash assistance for child care after talking with you and reviewing your application. For more help please call the DHS in your community:

If you have applied for childcare assistance through the Michigan DHS and did not qualify because your income was too high, you may qualify for help through the Women's Caring Program. Call 800-950-4171 for more information. Funding for this program is very limited and not always available.
