“What’s the Buzz” at Macomb County Library

CLINTON TOWNSHIP, Mich. – Children can learn about the world of honeybees and their importance to the environment at a free program at the Macomb County Library.

Teacher Eileen Byrnes will present a 45-minute interactive program about bees called “What’s the Buzz” at 2 p.m. Tuesday, July 22. Byrnes teaches at Grissom Middle School (Warren Consolidated Schools) in Sterling Heights.
