Macomb County offers Law Enforcement Academy for Seniors

MOUNT CLEMENS, Mich. – Registrations are being accepted for the “Law Enforcement Academy for Seniors,” a five-week series of classes to educate seniors on the workings of the Macomb County Sheriff’s Office and its different divisions.

The course is presented by Sheriff Mark A. Hackel with the assistance of the Macomb County Senior Citizen Services Department and will conclude with a tour of the Macomb County Jail.

Classes will be held at the Macomb County Sheriff’s Office Training Division, 43565 Elizabeth Road (west entrance) in Mount Clemens.

Five comprehensive workshops will be held Mondays on the following dates: April 20, 27, May, 4, 11, and 18. All workshops will begin at 9:30 a.m. and end by noon.

Topics will include: Dispatch, Courts, K-9 Unit, Detective Bureau, Evidence Technician, Youth Bureau, Gun Range, Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT), County of Macomb Enforcement Team (COMET), Macomb Area Computer Enforcement unit (MACE), Macomb Auto Theft Squad (MATS), Traffic, Marine Division, Dive Team and Explorers. The series ends with a jail tour and a graduation ceremony.

This is a free program, but registration is required. To register, call Robin Auten of Macomb County Senior Citizen Services at 586-466-8725.
