Six Macomb County cooling centers available

MOUNT CLEMENS, Mich. – Macomb County has six cooling centers available for residents who do not have air conditioning and want to beat the heat.

Two facilities are available to help homeless people:

- The Ray of Hope Day Center, 176 N. Gratiot Ave., Mount Clemens. Hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Phone 586-466-4413
- The Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team (MCREST), 20415 Erin St., Roseville. Hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Phone 586-415-5101

In addition to those, four temporary cooling centers are available.

Any county resident may drop in to cool off and read a book at the Macomb County Library, 16480 Hall Road (near Garfield), in Clinton Township. Hours are 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday and Saturday. Phone 586-286-6660. (Drinking fountains, but no vending machines available).

Hours are 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Phone 586-469-6313. (Lunch counter, drinking fountains and vending machines available).

Seniors or residents with disabilities are invited to cool off in the lobby of the Martha T. Berry Medical Care Facility, 43533 Elizabeth Road, Mount Clemens. Hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Phone 586-469-5265. (Drinking fountains and vending machines available).

Any county resident may drop in to keep cool at Freedom Hill County Park in the Independence Building, 15000 Metropolitan Parkway, Sterling Heights. Hours are 8:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday. Phone 586-979-8750. (Drinking fountains and limited vending machines are available).

Drop-in visitors must supply their own food and drinks when visiting the four temporary cooling centers.
