Flu shots offered at Health Centers

MOUNT CLEMENS, Mich. – The Macomb County Health Department is offering flu shots for county residents who want a vaccination to protect them during flu season. Flu shots will be available for adults and for children at least 6 months old.

Shots will be available on a walk-in basis at each of the Health Department's three main clinic locations. Locations and hours are as follows:

Mount Clemens: 43525 Elizabeth Road (Elizabeth and Groesbeck)
Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Wednesday: 9 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

St. Clair Shores: 25401 Harper Ave. (Harper near 10 Mile)
Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Monday: 9 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Warren: 27690 Van Dyke Ave. (Van Dyke near Martin)
Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Thursday: 9 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

People with access to the Internet can download vaccine information forms and consent forms from this Web site:

Completing the consent form in advance can mean less time spent at the Health Center.

A \$15 charge for each vaccination is payable with cash or check. The fee may also be billed to Medicare Part B or Medicaid for residents who are enrolled in those programs. Medicare or Medicaid billing requires recipients to show their ID card for the program and a valid driver's license or other form of photo identification. (Persons with HAP Medicare will need to pay \$15 or go to their medical provider.)
